1. LEVELS

Western Dressage Intro through Level 5, Western Dressage Suitability and Hack.

2. AWARDS

Ribbons awarded 1st-6th place in each class. Intro through Level 5 tests will be split for into the following categories for pinning purposes: AAYr/Jr and Open (if entries warrant).

Championship Awards: Championship and Reserve Ribbons for each of the following levels: (a) Introductory, (b) Basic, (c) Level 1, (d) Level 2, (e) Level 3, and (d) Level 4 and above. The Championships for Introductory, Basic, Level 1 and Level 2 will be awarded based on the average of three scores at that level (throughout the weekend); one score MUST be the highest test of that level. The Level 3 and Level 4 and above Championship will be based on the average of any two scores at Level 3 and Level 4 and above (throughout the weekend).

Additionally, for Championship Awards, AA/Jr/Yr will be separated from the Open competitors

3. ENTRIES

Pre-entries will NOT be accepted. Copy of USEF cards for horse, rider & owner who want to be eligible for HOTY points. Accepted list/entry status is emailed to competitors and updated regularly at www.wdama.org. Make checks payable to “WDAMA”. Online entries and credit card payments accepted through equestrianentries.com.

No refunds after closing date. Including “Acts of God”.

All scratches and changes must be received in writing. Email: liz@onthebitevents.com

All horses (including non-compete horses) must provide copy of coggins dated within 12 months of the show date to complete each entry. Coggins must be received prior to the closing date to avoid incomplete fees. **All horses entering competition grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus Vaccinations within six months per GR845. Competitors must provide documentation as requested by management.**

All riders, owners, trainers, lessees, and agents with horses entered in western dressage classes at USEF-licensed Regular and Local shows must be members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee at the show.

Class Fees:

- Intro through Level 5, Suitability & Hack classes: \$45.00/class

Other Fees:

- \$30.00 non-refundable office fee/entry
- \$23.00 USEF/Drug Fee
- \$35.00 show pass fee PER SHOW for all eligible adult WDAA Non-Members (\$25 for Juniors as defined in USEF GR128)

- \$20.00 fee for each change to entry after the closing date.
- \$50.00 fee for non-negotiable check.
- \$20.00 fee for incomplete entry not rectified before closing date. (Missing card copies, check, signatures, Coggins, etc.)
- \$50.00 post entry fee for all entries accepted after close
- Non-Competing horses if space allows. Advance notice required. \$60.00 + office fee.

Entry fees and stall assignments are non-transferable and non-refundable after the closing date for any reason.

A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels, at any one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class number). Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders. Rides will be limited to 4 tests per horse, excluding suitability, equitation, and hack. If there is a conflict with breed division rules regarding WD102.2, the breed division rules will govern.

4. TIMES

Tentative times will be posted on www.onthebitevents.com, www.foxvillage.com and emailed to competitors *five* days before the event. During and after the show, results are posted to the same links. All ride times, including pre-printed show program, are to be considered tentative until noon the day before the show. Official show times will be available in the show office. Please check day sheets to confirm correct ride times. Classes may begin as early as 7:30 AM and will not run in numerical order.

5. STABLING

Overnight and day stalls will be assigned on a “first come first serve” basis by entry receipt. High quality, permanent (12x10 and 12x12) stalls with doors -\$75 overnight, \$40 day stall. Stalls must be left stripped. A \$25 fee will be charged for stalls not stripped. NO ELECTRIC FANS. Battery powered fans are permissible.

7. DIRECTIONS

GPS address to the Equestrian Center: 56 Park Street, South Hadley MA.

From I-91 North, take Exit 16 (Holyoke) onto Rt. 202 North. Follow through many traffic lights. Go over the Connecticut river. At the rotary, take the second right onto Rt. 202 North. Just past the college on your right, take a right onto either Church St or Park St. At the top of the hill take a left into the Equestrian Center driveway. Park in the back lot.

From I-91 South, take Exit 20. Take left at the first set of lights onto Damon Road. Take a left onto Rt. 9 East. Go across the bridge. Take the first right just before Getty Station. Take first right at the stop sign onto Rt. 47 South. Follow to the end (aprx. 8 miles). At the stop sign, go kitty corner across Rt.116 onto Park Street. Follow as above.

From the Mass Pike. Take Exit 5. Bear to the right after toll booth. Turn left on Rt.33, drive approximately 5 miles. Take a right onto Rt. 116 north, drive 1.5 mile to the College. Turn right onto Church St, which turns into Park St. Equestrian Center entrance will be on the left.

8. FOOTING

Two indoor arenas with GGT Footing measuring 230x100' and 70x110' respectively. Outdoor sand arena. Rings will be maintained to an optimum standard. Intro classes will compete in a small (20 x 40 meter) arena. Basic and above classes will compete in a standard (20 x 60 meter) arena.

The outdoor arena space is 20x60 m sand and has Euro-felt footing.

9. ENTERTAINMENT

Vendors, including food, will be following COVID-19 protocols and may or may not be available. Current information will be listed on our website and emailed to competitors.

10. OTHER

The show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes.

Farrier: On call each day, see show office for contact/details.

Veterinarian: On call each day. Number posted at office.

Sharps container in show office and in each barn.

Show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally and/or cancel awards of prizes without claims for damages & change order of classes, cancel, split, or combine classes at its discretion if entries deem necessary.

Numbers must be worn at all times while a horse is out of their stall.

11. DOGS

Dogs are welcome but must be on a 6' leash at all times and are NOT allowed in warm up areas! No expandable leashes. Any loose dogs will result in owner being charged \$50 that will be donated to the local Humane Society. Any dog becoming a nuisance will be asked to leave the grounds.

12. USEF MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

13. USEF SAFE SPORT STATEMENT

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

14. HEADGEAR LAWS

The Northeast Western Dressage Championship will adhere to all requirements of USEF GR801 relating to protective headgear.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("**Liability**") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. 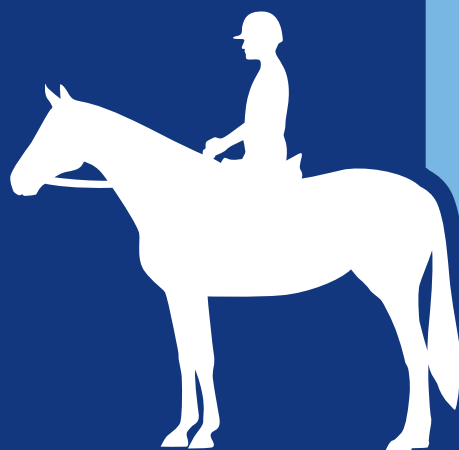
